Proposal to Delete the B.S. degree in English Education

Anticipated Date of Implementation: 2002-2003 Catalog

Rationale:

The English Department seeks to eliminate the B.S. degree in English Education for both philosophical and practical reasons. On a practical level, we feel that foreign language competency is essential to contemporary life as we experience increasing levels of globalization in our culture and economy. Moreover, our public schools are serving more ESL students than ever before, so a heightened sensitivity toward cultural differences and the difficulties of thinking and communicating in more than one language is crucial. We also feel that the elimination of the B.S. will have a positive impact on the commitment Illinois high schools make to foreign language instruction, as more students will consider experience in a foreign language an important preparation for university study.

Philosophically speaking, the Statement of Purpose for the Bachelor of Arts Degree as provided in the Baccalaureate Degree Document is more in keeping with the goals and mission of the English Department as a whole. Specifically, the B.A. degree goals of "creative thinking, abilities in the critical analyses of texts, the understanding of culture, and a working knowledge of social, political, and historical contexts" are at the heart of the English Studies model. Eliminating the Bachelor of Science degree will also eliminate the sense that there is a substantial difference in the goals of the English and English Education programs.

Arrangements to be made for program faculty and students:

Since we are retaining the B.A degree in English Education, no special arrangements need to be made for program faculty or students.

Anticipated impact on other campus programs:

Other than perhaps a slightly increased enrollment in foreign language, we foresee no significant impact on other campus programs as a result of the deletion.

Anticipated budgetary effect:

We foresee no budgetary effect as a result of the deletion.
