6. Rationale for Proposal:

The Program Management and Commercial Recreation sequences in the Recreation and Park Administration (RPA) curriculum had not been reviewed for over ten years. During this time, the distinctions between Commercial Recreation (e.g., resorts, convention and visitors bureaus, the fitness industry, tourism industries, etc.) and Program Management (e.g., park districts, youth serving agencies, non-profit agencies, etc.) have blurred. Topics of study (marketing, finance, risk management, alternate sources of funding) which were previously unique to one sequence or the other are now common to both sequences. Therefore, the proposed the new sequence is Recreation Management (under separate program cover) and request the deletion of Program Management (and Commercial Recreation under separate program cover).

7. Arrangements to be made for program faculty and students

Since the proposed Recreation Management sequence will replace Program Management sequence, it is anticipated that new students will be advised to select from either the Recreation Management or Therapeutic Recreation sequences. The number of courses in the proposed Recreation Management sequence is unchanged so faculty will be unaffected.

9. Anticipated impact on other campus programs

Since the proposed Recreation Management sequence will replace Program Management sequence, it is anticipated that there will be no adverse impact on other campus programs.

10. Anticipated budgetary effect

Since the proposed Recreation Management Sequence will replace the Program Management sequence, it is anticipated that there will be no budgetary change in this new sequence as current faculty will be teaching the new and revised courses.
