# Program Title: <u>Sequence in Food Industry Science</u>

# **CIPS classification (if applicable):**

# Anticipated date of implementation: Immediately

### **Rationale:**

The sequence in Food Industry Science was approved in November of 2003 and appeared in the 2004-05 catalog. The faculty of the Department of Agriculture recommends that this sequence be deleted. The outside curriculum review consultants recommended in their report "We unanimously believe that the food industry science sequence is not appropriate to be offered at this time. While we believe that this sequence would add diversity to the curricular offerings, currently there is insufficient faculty in the Department of Agriculture and the Department of Family and Consumer Sciences to provide the depth of science required in this curriculum."

The sequence required cooperative development and offering of courses in Agriculture and Family and Consumer Science Departments. Enrollment pressures in both departments (low in Agriculture and high in other sequences in Family and Consumer Science) resulted in one of the required courses not being taught. The deletion of this sequence will not impact overall enrollment in the Department and will help streamline the Department's curricular offerings.
