RE: Proposal to Delete the Minor in Foreign Languages in the Elementary School

The University Curriculum Committee has approved and is forwarding for Academic Senate review the attached Department of Languages, Literatures, and Cultures proposal to delete the Minor in Foreign Languages in the Elementary School (FLES).

The Department of Languages, Literatures, and Cultures' rationale for the deletion of the minor is "because candidates in teacher education are certified K-12, there is no longer a specific need for a minor in foreign language education for elementary schools. There are no longer specific courses available for this minor and teacher education candidates will be able to teach foreign languages in elementary schools under the current K-12 certification."

Over a year ago, the key course for the minor was eliminated due to lack of enrollment for four years or more. The department states that they will accommodate the very small number of students who have enrolled in the minor by working with them individually to meet their requirements through clinical hours and student teaching.

If approved by the Academic Senate, the Minor in Foreign Languages in the Elementary School will be removed from the 2012-2014 Undergraduate Catalog.

Rationale for proposal: Because candidates in teacher education are certified for K-12, there is no longer a specific need for a minor in foreign language education for elementary schools. There are no longer specific courses available for this minor and TE candidates will be able to teach foreign languages in elementary schools under the current K-12 certification.
Arrangements to be made for program faculty and students: There are a very small number of students who have enrolled in this minor. The key course for the minor was deleted due to the four and out rule over a year ago. Since then, we have received minimal inquiries. In case students wish to complete this minor, we will work with them individually to meet their requirements through clinical hours and student teaching. The department currently does not have faculty specifically assigned to teaching FLES, so there will be no adverse impact on the department's instructional capacity or course load.
